The government has published a final date of October 1, 2013 for implementation of ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS. This webinar will give you an introduction into these new coding systems and will assist you in preparing for training and other necessary items to assure your facility is ready for the changes. This is at a high level for administration, finance, HIM and coding professionals. No prior coding experience is required.

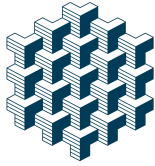
