The CMS Hospital Infection Control Worksheet, Proposed Changes and Antibiotic Stewardship Program

Infection control is hit hard during a hospital survey, so every facility should have a full-working familiarity with the CMS interpretive guidelines, as well as the proposed changes for assessing compliance with the infection control Conditions of Participation (CoPs).
