CMS Hospital CoP and TJC Telemedicine Standards: Telemedicine Credentialing & Privileging

Program Overview

Are you familiar with the federal regulations along with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) interpretive guidelines of telemedicine? CMS has conditions of participation (CoPs) interpretive guidelines for all hospitals regarding their telemedicine standards. The regulations and interpretive guidelines also impact hospitals accredited by the Joint Commission (TJC). This program will discuss the most problematic standards in the telemedicine interpretive guidelines.

The regulations cover the revised credentialing and privileging process for physicians and practitioners providing telemedicine services. This revised process is less burdensome and, in turn, is now a smaller financial liability for hospitals. Attendees will learn all about the regulations and interpretive guidelines and the responsibilities of the board, medical staff and hospitals to ensure compliance with the regulations and to ensure a hospital's compliance.
