Program Overview

Clinicians and other healthcare workers serve sexual and gender minority people every day, but adequate preparation about supporting these populations is rarely offered professional training. Using a Cultural Humility framework, this workshop provides a broad overview of LGBTQ+ terms, gender identity concepts, cultural beliefs, health disparities, and barriers to accessing services, as well as best practice strategies for creating an affirming care experience.

Program Objectives

- Identify developmental, structural, family systems, & psychosocial challenges sexual and gender minority people may encounter.
- Explore intersectional identities, disparate risk factors within the LGBTQ community, and the impacts of minority stress; apply the principles of Cultural Humility and Structural Competence to LGBTQ healthcare.
- Recognize gender identity concepts & terms, including transgender & nonbinary identities, using appropriate pronouns, respectful language & etiquette.
- Increase tools and skills to be an ally to LGBTQ patients, colleagues, friends and family
